WHAT: This program provides \$250.00 for each eligible school age child (K-12) for the purchase of school supplies and clothing only. Personal items are not approved.

Applications can be obtained at ACDJFS or online at ashlandjfs.org.

WHEN: Applications can be submitted starting June 16, 2025, through the close of business on June 27, 2025. This program may be discontinued earlier if funding is exhausted. This program is limited to Ashland County residents only.

WHERE: Applications must be received in any of the following ways:

- (1) Hand-delivered or mailed to ACDJFS at 15 West 4th Street, Ashland, Ohio 44805.
- (2) Faxed to 419-282-5009; or
- (3) Emailed to Ashland_verification@jfs.ohio.gov; or
- (4) Placed in the agency drop box located outside our agency at the front entrance.

Applications will not be accepted before June 16, 2025, and not after June 27, 2025.

WHAT DO I NEED? Submit a completed application and provide verification of entire household income for the prior 30 days. To be eligible at least one member of the household assistance group must be employed and working a minimum of 20 hours per week (not averaged) in that period. * If, during the 30-day period, a holiday or employment shutdown has occurred, the affected week(s) may be waived for consideration. **

Applications will not be accepted without all required documentation.

No in-person interview is necessary.

WHEN & WHERE DO I SHOP? Each approved application will be assigned a shopping day in August at Ashland Wal-Mart.

Approved applicants will receive *notice of approval* with shopping details including dates, times, and purchase guidelines.

^{*}Up to a 60-day period of work history may be considered to meet the weekly work-requirement.

^{**} If the household assistance group contains only one adult member and that person is receiving SSI, SSD or other documented disability payments, the work-requirement is waived. If the assistance group contains two adults, one must be meeting the work requirement, or both must be receiving documented disability payments to qualify.
